Annuities: More flexible than you might think

Annuities are easily misunderstood, in part because of their name. When you "annuitize" the money you've paid into an annuity (plus the interest it has earned), you've chosen to receive monthly payments for life or for a fixed period. However, annuitizing this money isn't your only option. You may also treat an annuity like a Guaranteed Investment Certificate (GIC). That is, you use the annuity as a way to accumulate savings and earn a steady interest rate. You can make withdrawals from the annuity for any reason, although you may then owe income tax on some or all of the withdrawal amount. If you do choose to annuitize, you also have several payout options. The point is these products are flexible enough to serve a variety of needs.
