I hope you have been having a restful and renewing summer season; God's gift to us so we can answer His call "Come to me, all you who labor and find life burdensome, and I will give you rest... learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart, and your souls will find rest, for my yoke is easy and my burden is light." You may wonder: 'how does that work?' To understand, you must also hear Jesus say that we must "become like little children".
