Mulch Sale 2013

On Saturday, April 13, 2013, The Columbia Council very successfully completed a Spring Fundraiser, for the benefit of the Council. After soliciting yard mulch orders by email, phone, postal mail and table at the weekend masses for parts of February and April, and all of March, 2 big truckloads of bagged mulch were delivered at 6 am to the eastern side of the Wilde Lake Parking Lot. The first load went out by small truck before 7 AM and all loads were distributed to customers by 1:30 PM.



The activity in the parking lot attracted the attention of passers-by, who added contact information for the 2014 Mulch Drive.

Many Brother Knights assisted with the work. Various knights worked long and hard with the solicitation of the orders, the bookkeeping of the orders and funds, the generation of travel maps for the use of the drivers, and the support of the workers with food and drink. Many brothers showed up Saturday morning, some with teenaged sons, to load the mulch, to drive trucks and vans, and to unload the mulch at the customers' driveways. The work of so many Brother Knights contributed to the success of this Council Activity.

Tanzania Children's Project

The Knights would like to thank the St. John's Parish for its extensive support of the Tanzanian Children's Project (TCP) over the past four years. To-date, we are approaching a total of \$70,000 raised which has been used to build the Malowa Medical Dispensary in Tanzania, Africa. We are pleased to announce that after 3½ years, the dispensary has opened. The dispensary is currently being stocked with medical equipment and the first patients have already been seen and are receiving care.

Some additional money will need to be sent to fully open and staff the dispensary. Our next project is the construction of a Catholic primary school. We will begin to raise money for the school starting with the next fundraiser on June 2, 2013.
